FINANCE

Resolution No. 009-2025

Adopted resolution approving the preliminary Engineer's Report for Consolidated Landscaping and Lighting Assessment District No. HG-LLA1 and declaring the City Council's intent to levy an assessment for Fiscal Year 2025-2026, and setting a public hearing on the proposed levy at the regular City Council meeting on Wednesday, June 25, 2025.

PUBLIC WORKS

Ocean Blue Environmental Services

Approved a Cooperative Services Agreement with Ocean Blue Environmental Services, Inc., to provide on-call and emergency hazardous materials removal services. In order to maintain regulatory compliance, the city must have an agreement in place for on-call and emergency services, including certified emergency response to hazardous waste spills; submission of detailed manifests including final disposal; and the removal/disposal of the city workload generated waste including paint aerosol cans, oil, chemicals, and fluorescent/LED lights.

Commercial Aquatic Services

Approved an agreement with Commercial Aquatic Services, Inc., for splash pad maintenance, chemical balance, and associated services for the Clarkdale Park Splash pad.

City Hall Roof Replacement, Project 118

Awarded a construction contract to Courtney, Inc. for the City Hall Roof Replacement, Project 118. This project will re-roof approximately 10,500 square feet of roofing area to prevent water penetration and damage to the main structural frame.

Street Rehabilitation Project Update

Received and filed an update on the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (STBG) through the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) Grant. The City is set to receive \$1.5 million for a Citywide Street Restriping, Speed Feedback, and Traffic Calming project.
