Summary of the actions taken at the City Council meeting

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Resolution No. 015-2025

Adopted resolution approving participation in the Los Angeles County Permanent Local Housing Allocation Program. The LACDA has allocated \$60,669 for Hawaiian Gardens. Funds would be used to pay for a shelter bed. The City would be reserving one shelter bed for one year at the Bell Shelter that is run by The Bell Salvation Army. The beds would be reserved as "Crisis/Bridge Housing Beds" for single adults +18 years and older.

Resolution No. 013-2025

Adopted resolution fixing the appropriations limitation in the City of Hawaiian Gardens for Fiscal Year 2025-2026. This limits the amount of revenue that can be appropriated in any fiscal year to the Proceeds of Taxes.

Resolution No. 014-2025

Adopted resolution ordering the levy and collection of assessments within the City of Hawaiian Gardens Consolidated Landscaping and Lighting District No. HGLLA1 for Fiscal Year 2025-2026, the adopted resolution provides for the continued funding of street lighting and landscape maintenance throughout the City of Hawaiian Gardens.

PUBLIC WORKS

C. Robert Lee Activity Center Renovation Project Update

The City was approved to receive \$1 million from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under the FY 2024 CPF program, which will be disbursed upon successful completion of the project. The renovation of the C. Robert Lee Activity Center will include significant structural, mechanical, plumbing, and electrical upgrades. Planned improvements include the refurbishment of restrooms, basketball courts, stages, racquetball courts, hallways, the gymnasium, and the boxing room. The project will also feature the installation of new lighting, sound systems, flooring, and interior paint.

HVAC Maintenance Contracts

Approved contracts with Onshore Mechanical Inc., and Mesa Energy Systems, Inc., for on-call HVAC maintenance and repair services. Having two contractors ensures sufficient coverage, promotes competitive pricing, and enhances service delivery across all City facilities.
